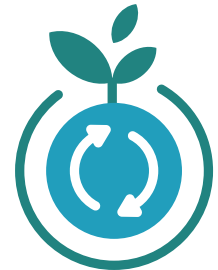

Introduction to

Restorative Practices

In this session, participants will learn about the purpose and value of using restorative practices (RP), which are designed to strengthen relationships between individuals as well as social connections within communities in order to repair harm when conflict occurs and to proactively meet students' needs so misbehavior is less common. We will also focus on the significance of each of the five RP practices and how to use RP to promote fair discipline practices for all students.



Our ESCLEW trainers have been extensively trained through Eastern Michigan University and have the knowledge and passion to inspire each participant to apply restorative practices with their students. We hope you can join us to learn about practices that have the power to transform lives and relationships.
